Eligibility

The art contest is open to all American Indian and Alaska Native students in Wisconsin, grades 6-12.

Art Contest Rules and Guidelines

- Student artists are asked to submit a piece of artwork that reflects the theme of this year’s WIEA Conference: **Revitalizing Tribal Nations through Community Engagement.**
- Artwork will be judged by members of Menikanaehkem-Community Rebuilders, based on the following criteria:
 - Originality and creativity
 - Relationship of the work to the theme: **Revitalizing Tribal Nations through Community Engagement.**
- The submitted artwork cannot be larger than 11 by 17 inches. Unfortunately, we cannot accept three-dimensional pieces.
- Each piece of artwork must be submitted with an official Application and Release Form.
- One submission per student
- **The winning selection will receive \$150 and the runner-up will receive \$50**

Contest Deadline

Artwork must be submitted no later than **Friday, March 9, 2018**. Entries that are mailed must be postmarked by that date.
